New Report Cards

- Two Hamber teachers participating in the pilot Bobby Gibson PE teacher and Tiffany Yip EL science class will not be assigning letter grade to their grade 8 and 9 classes
- Parents are aware and can ask for letter grades if needed

Redesign curriculum - implementation

- Numeracy assessment
- Grade 11 provincial exam will no longer be required
- Grade 12 English provincial this will be the last year
- June 2020 literacy assessment replaces English 12 provincial
- Letter will be sent home to parents in Feb.
- Numeracy assessment will be an electronic exam over 4 days at end of June for all grade 10's and 11's
- Not tied to a math course
- If completed math 8 ready to write numeracy assessment, SS, language arts, science
- practice exams links will be sent out
- Marked on a scale: achieving, developing, emerging
- Can repeat exam up to 3 times
- Course planning sent home on survey talk about different course offerings
- Planning 10 will be replaced with Career Life Education

Same qualifications as full-time teachers Board HR Dept. too small to deal with the hiring needs If parents not able to attend the teacher conferences, they can contact teachers directly. Marea Jensen Board is hiring but having difficulty attracting teachers. Teachers in Alta. make \$20,000 more, than teachers in BC Teachers also moving away. Many accepting jobs in other districts closer to home. Salaries in province pretty much the same, but housing prices lower outside of Vancouver.
