He met the staff and small group of aboriginal students. He was really impressed with women's choir. He gave a gift for the school to perform a song. All aboriginal songs belong to the families. They have to gift a song to you before you can sing it. Students were moved by Shane's visit. He spoke of residential visits. Aboriginal history will be part of school curriculum.

7. New Business	 Sylvia, grade parent stated – grade 8 students heard something happened at the Halloween dance. How do we ensure the grade 8 students feel safe at the school. Alex - At school assembly, the rules and expectations are talked about and drugs, alcohol and weapons are addressed. We treat those things seriously and will act on it. Students deserve to feel safe – if they observe anything, they need to know they can bring to me or any adults and it will be dealt with. Alex met with the parents and students who were taken to hospital from the Halloween dance. The kids were honest and took responsibility for their actions. When dealing with students who make a mistake – understand what they did wrong, student apologizes. If not, apply consequences for student and for the other students to know. Community service to help in the office. Alcohol consumed outside of dance. We can't guarantee other kids didn't have alcohol and drugs. There is security at the door – water bottles – had to be dumped. Students going through 3 layers before they get into the school: principal, security, student council. Student council works with school to get message out to students. School counsellor – make good decisions. If kids seeing something – they report it. New Sassy worker – runs capacity Café – parents can listen to teenagers talk about sex, alcohol, drugs Parent inquired about putting hooks in the boys and girls washrooms. Alex will look into it.
